One Steward must be allocated to testing and carry out no other tasks that day normal stewarding duties pre and post testing. • When the Vet arrives, the Steward brings the Vet to the President of the Ground Jury and a random selection of animals to be tested throughout the day is made prior to the beginning of the class (the random selection process previously accumulated can be used as a guideline if wished but is not essential) by the President of the Ground Jury. • The horses animals selected could be taken from any SJI class in any arena on the day • The steward will then accompany the selected horse animal to the next available animal with the designated faults can be taken the Vet in the testing box along with the person responsible for the horse animal. • If on return to the entrance to the arena the next animal selected has been missed then the next available animal with the designated faults can be taken. Then the steward must consult the President of the Ground Jury for new criteria.
